GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS - 2011

1. All entry fees MUST accompany entry forms. Entry fees are

Judging only – All Divisions - \$ 6.00 (plus HST) – Entry forms must be filled out.

Exhibitor Fee for each member entering is \$ 5.00 (plus HST)

Post entries will be accepted up to **4:00 pm on August 31, 2011** for Open Single entries – Lamb or Beef – a \$25.00 (non taxable) post entry fee per entry – in addition to the above listed entry fees. No post entries will be listed in the catalogue. **All entry fees are subject to HST charges.**

2. No entry refunds will be given for any Lamb, Beef, Rabbit, Dog or Llama entries. Horse entry fees, less \$15.00 office charge, will be refunded if the office receives a veterinarian or doctor's certificate within 7 days prior to the beginning of the Fair.
3. **All entry forms must be completed, signed and money enclosed (INCLUDING CCIA / IDENTIFICATION #'s).** Failing to have the entry form completed will result in it being returned to the contributor and it will then be the contributor's responsibility to return the corrected entry form prior to closing date.
4. Only a leader who registers a 4-H member at Provincial Winter Fair may delete that member from the show, **or change a project's VERIFIED identification number in the case of a lost or missing ear tag.**
5. All clubs attending Provincial Winter Fair must be represented at the Annual General Meeting and one other meeting that is set up by the individual Provincial Winter Division Fair rep.
6. ***All animals entered at PWF may be used for judging classes and for Round Robin Competition. This is a condition of entry. NO EXCEPTIONS*** – If the owner, leader or club representative is not present at the stall area, the Division Rep/Round Robin Committee has the right to safely remove the animal from its stall for the purpose of Round Robin or Judging Competitions.

7. Contributor must be a registered 4-H member in the project of the Grooming and Fitting division in which they wish to compete. It is **mandatory** for every club entered in PWF to enter one team in their division's Grooming and Fitting, provided they have an eligible member. These Grooming & Fitting points will count towards Club Aggregates. The penalty for not entering will be the loss of Aggregate points for your club.
8. Upon the discovery of fraud, deception or dishonest practice which may have affected or have tended to affect the decision of the Judges, the Committee has the power to withhold awards and may prohibit the offending party or parties from exhibition in any class for one or more years, and may also publish the name of such deemed expedient. Fraud, deception or dishonest practice shall include defacing an exhibit by altering the natural structure or natural conformation of same by any means whatsoever. Protests must be submitted in writing to the Committee prior to, or during, the sale.
9. For the purpose of competing in this exhibition, unethical fitting will be deemed to consist of any treatment or operation materially altering the structure of the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body such as the introduction of air, liquid or other substances in any part of the body, surgical operations to correct defects, or the performances of any act or operation to exaggerate the natural conformation of the animal. There are two exceptions to this rule and are limited exclusively to the following:
 - I) All castrated male animals are to be castrated by one of the following methods:
 - a) surgical castration;
 - b) Burdizzo emasculator, or
 - c) Elastrator
 - II) **all sheep tails must be docked at a level no shorter than the distal end of the caudal tail fold by one of the following methods:**
 - a) **Burdizzo emasculator;**
 - b) **Elastrator, or**
 - c) **Hot iron or electric docker**
10. The Committee reserves the right to decide any point not covered by the rules which the Committee considers necessary in the proper regulation and management of the show and sale. The decision of the Committee shall be final in all cases.
11. All grievances of any kind will be heard by a Grievance Committee of three, represented by the Chairperson of the PWF Committee, one other person appointed by the PWF Committee, and the rep from the 4-H or Open Division involved in the Grievance.
12. 4-H members absent from the Provincial Winter Fair due to sickness, health, a legitimate 4-H function, or educational reason may have another 4-H member show the animal in the age classes of heifers and cow-calf and in the weight classes of steers and lambs, but will not receive a score in showmanship. In all group competitions, the animal must be shown by the owner.
13. In order that a member's points be counted for the Division Aggregate Club Awards, the member must compete in at least two classes. If a member wants to do judging at PWF, he may do so and this will not affect the aggregate results. Those members who will be judging only, must pay a \$ 6.00 entry fee (plus HST).
14. The Provincial Winter Fair age breaks for BEEF and LAMB and HORSE projects will be Jr. 9 – 11, Int 12 – 14. Senior 15 and over. Exception is for the Bank of Montreal and Toronto Dominion Bank Competitions which will be Junior 12 and under, and Senior 13 and over. All ages are as of the previous December 31st.
15. All 4-H Beef, Lamb and Senior Management members with two units of a project have the choice of using their market animal or their female project for Showmanship. **Office must be notified by 9 AM Friday which entry they plan to use, or the steer or market lamb project will automatically be used.**
16. **No non-competing dogs will be allowed in the show barn and livestock area.** Any Rep and/or the Grievance Committee has the right to remove any dog and owner from the grounds if:

- a) the dog does not have an official tag attached to its collar
 - b) the dog and its owner/handler are not conforming to any of the General Barn or dog Division Rules.
17. Leaders responsibility bringing a club to PWF shall be to ensure that each member:
- a) be prepared for the competition
 - b) be on time to classes
 - c) be prepared for championship classes should they qualify
 - d) take part in as many of the competitions offered that they are eligible for.
 - e) **Reminder:** it is the responsibility of the 4-H member to be ready and at ringside prior to their class(es) and sale spot. Whipper-ins will not go "hunt" down members. Members must understand that if they are close to missing their class – they WILL miss their class – **NO EXCEPTIONS**. The gate will not open for any late members once the class has begun.
18. It shall be the responsibility of the parents of 4-H members and those minors exhibiting in the open competitions, that they conduct themselves in accordance to the rules of competition and general rules. It shall be the parent's responsibility to ensure that their children are aware of the rules with regard to the use of alcohol or drugs, and no exceptions will be made by the committee.
19. **Strict monitoring of grooming to eliminate parental help will be enforced. 4-H members must be the ones that are doing the grooming and fitting.** Adults can help at any time to meet safety concerns or emergencies. Adults can help, coach, advise or teach (at appropriate times) as long as they do not perform the tasks of the 4-H members during the 4-H section of the show. It is the responsibility of the 4-H leader to ensure the parents understand and adhere to these rules. Any breach of the rules are to be reported by the Grievance Committee via a green grievance form obtained at the PWF office for them to handle.
20. The use of **ALCOHOL** and/or **DRUGS** is strictly prohibited by 4-H members and open contributors who are minors. Anyone found to be in the possession of, or to have consumed alcohol and/or drugs shall forfeit all right to competition and any reward, including prize money, shall be forfeited without recourse. Market animals will be removed at the contributor's expense and a commission calculated on average weight for that division shall be assessed at the time of removal of said animal.
21. **NOTICE TO PARENTS!** 4-H members or those persons under the legal age staying at the PWF and during PWF; it shall be your responsibility to ensure their compliance with the general rules at all times.
22. If, in the opinion of the committee, market stock entries are not of show standard, the contributor may take them home if he so desires or they will be disposed of by the committee to the best advantage of both parties, and the proceeds credited to the contributor. All accumulated charges incurred will be deducted.
23. All incidents with unruly animals to be reported to the grievance committee so they can be dealt with properly.
24. All market stock entries shown must be sold through the sale ring. **4-H and OPEN Female** projects and their progeny may be sold at the member's discretion. **The PWF office must be notified as to the intention of the sale of female projects and their progeny by Noon PM on the Friday of PWF. Time Change!!!!**
25. The exhibitor (or representative of that exhibitor) selling a carcass must be present in the sale ring with required information, which will be supplied by the Carcass Committee. If a contributor is not present and misses their spot on the sale sheet, they will automatically drop to the end of the sale.
26. Six percent (6%) of the amount of each sale will be retained by the Kamloops Exhibition Association to assist them in meeting general expenses.
27. Only first and second place animals in each weight/breed class will be allowed to compete for Championships – whereas Showmanship class finalists will be determined based on the showmanship method (ie: Danish [1st, 2nd, 3rd row] vs Placement Method [1-6th place]).

28. Both Beef and Lamb carcasses will be sold in blocks of 5 throughout the sale.

29. ORDER OF SALE TO BE AS FOLLOWS:

BEEF SALE

Grand and Reserve Champion Steer, Champion 4-H and Champion Open Single, Reserve Champion 4-H and Reserve Champion Open Single; Grand and Reserve Champion Carcass, Champion 4-H and Champion Open Single Carcass, Reserve Champion 4-H and Open Single Carcass, followed by 4-H Steer Entries, sold in order of class placing, followed by Open Single Steer entries, sold in order of placing. All other carcasses will be sold throughout the sale in blocks by order of placings. Any Female Projects and their progeny registered for sale.

LAMB SALE - ALL LAMBS (Including Carcasses) TO BE SOLD BY THE DOLLAR

Grand and Reserve Champion Lamb, Champion 4-H Lamb, Champion Youth Open Lamb, Champion Open Single Lamb, Reserve Champion 4-H Lamb, Reserve Champion Youth Open Lamb, Reserve Champion Open Single Lamb; Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Lamb Carcass, Champion 4-H Lamb Carcass, Champion Open Single Lamb Carcass, Reserve Champion 4-H Lamb Carcass, Reserve Champion Open Single Lamb Carcass followed by 4-H Lambs in order of class placing, Youth Open Lambs in order of class placing, Open Single Lambs in of class placing, and Groups of Three Lambs in order of class placing. All other carcasses will be sold throughout the sale in blocks. Any Female Projects and their progeny registered for sale.

There will be no re-sales at this year's sale. All projects donated back will be rail graded with those proceeds going to the charity of the buyer's choice.

LAMB AND BEEF PROJECTS TO BE SOLD ALTERNATLEY

30. If a contributor misses his or her spot on the sale sheet, they will automatically drop to the end of the sale.
31. Assistance will be given to buyers in the assembling and loading of purchases. The shipping superintendent will have entire charge of assembling and loading arrangements.
32. BARN RELEASES MUST BE OBTAINED FOR REMOVAL OF ALL LIVESTOCK FROM THE BARN, INCLUDING ALL FEMALE PROJECTS. THIS RULE APPLIES TO BEEF AND LAMB PROJECTS ONLY. NO ANIMALS TO BE REMOVED FROM THE BARN PRIOR TO 3 PM ON SUNDAY.
33. No dismantling, take down or tear down of Beef and Lamb stalls, boards, clipping chutes, mats, or fix decorations till the last animal is sold on Sale Day, any offending Club will be fined \$100.00. Contents of tack room can be removed, **unless an exception is made by the individual division.**
34. All animals must be free from contagious or infectious disease. Infected animals will not be allowed in the barn.
35. All necessary examinations and required tests will be conducted by a licensed veterinarian, which may be called on site.
36. All animals that become sick must be treated by a licensed veterinarian and must be announced at the time of sale. Owners shall have the option of taking the animal home on payment of commission on the net weight and average price, with the exception of Champions.
37. Use of tranquilizers on stock entered in the show is forbidden. An animal found to be treated will be disqualified.
38. A judge has the right to dismiss a contributor for inappropriate behavior.
